



GET THE MOST OUT OF YOUR FESTIVAL

Welcome to the first World Beer Festival-Columbia. With hundreds of beers here for you to sample, it is impossible to try them all. Here are some strategies to make the most of your experience.

Make a plan

Pick a theme to organize your tasting choice:

- Taste beers from one nation or region, e.g. Belgium, or the American South.
- Select one style and compare examples from different breweries, e.g. India pale ales.
- Taste a range of bitter beers: pale ales, India pale ales and German pilsners.
- Taste a range of sweeter, malty beers: Scottish ales, German and Czech dark beers, porters and stouts.

How to taste beer

- First, look at the beer, and notice its color and head.
- Next, smell the beer's aromas.
- Taste the beer, and see how the flavor develops.
- Talk over your impression with friends, or make notes.

Come to a "tutored tasting"

 Hear from an expert at the All About Beer Magazine booth every hour.

Smart habits

- In any sequence of beers, start with lighter flavors and move to heavier ones.
- Rinse your glass between samples.
- Feel free to experiment and pour out beers you don't like.
- Take a break every few samples to drink water, eat or relax.
- Know your limits, and stay safe.









AN INTRODUCTION TO BEER STYLES

The excitement surrounding beer these days is the discovery of lesser-known styles outside the mainstream. Here is just a handful:

Lager beers, the family of beers from the German and central European tradition, are clean and crisp:



- **Pilsner.** Aromatic, full of pleasantly bitter hop character, soft and quenching.
- **Dunkel.** Ruby brown in color; full of toffeeish, bready and caramelized notes; low on hop bitterness.
- **Bock.** Bocks, maibocks and doppelbocks are malty, sweet and strong, but also clean and refreshing.
- Schwarzbier. The darkest of the lager styles. Lightly roasty bitter chocolate flavor, balanced by drying bitterness.

Ale beers from Britain and Belgium, are fruitier than lagers, with more unusual secondary flavors:

- Pale ale. Golden amber to copper; bready, lightly caramel flavors balanced with aromatic bitterness.
- India pale ale. Similar to pale ale, but bigger in every respect, with a vigorous bitter finish.
- Scottish ales. Low in hop bitterness, the emphasis is on rich, substantial malted barley flavor, with a clean finish.
- Porter. Deep brown; toasty and chocolatey flavor. Hop bitterness varies.
- **Stout.** Deep, roasted flavor, a touch of burnt toast, chocolate and espresso.



Wheat ales use wheat in addition to barley as their grain base, which gives them a fresh, spritzy character.



- Belgian wit beer. Pale, almost milky, with aromas of spices, such as coriander and curação (bitter) orange peel. Silky and refreshing.
- **Hefeweizen.** Cloudy, with a handsome head, a Germanstyle hefeweizen has notes of banana, clove and bubblegum.
